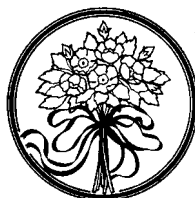

“The Responsorial Psalm”

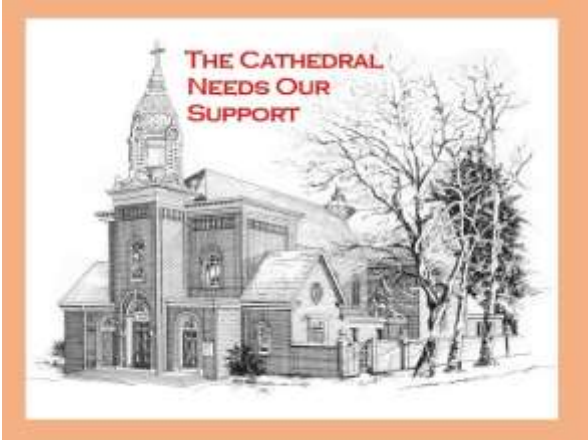
Continuing the practice of the Jewish synagogue, Christians traditionally sang a psalm or biblical canticle after the first reading. In Rome, a cantor or subdeacon approached the ambo. They stood on one of its lower steps (gradus) and began to chant which was eventually called the gradual. The psalm verses were sung by the soloist, and the people responded with a short refrain which was frequently taken from the psalm itself. Once more flowery melodies evolved, the psalm text was abbreviated, and the singing was done by a trained body of singers.

Today the responsorial psalm has been restored to a place of very special importance. It should always be sung when possible, and the whole assembly participates by singing the response. Very frequently the psalm has a textual or spiritual relationship to one of the readings. At times psalms called “common psalms” can be used instead of a prescribed psalm for the day, for example Psalm 118 “This is the day...” during the Easter Season.

In today’s first reading, God uses a “tiny whispering sound” to call the prophet Elijah in the midst of wind, earthquakes and fire. He does the same today: in the midst of hundreds of cable and satellite channels and millions of internet websites, God still speaks gently. **National Day of Remembrance
For Aborted Children
Saturday, September 9**

10:00 AM Cathedral Cemetery

You are invited to attend a prayer service at the graveside of aborted children at Cathedral Cemetery, 2400 Lancaster Avenue in Wilmington, on Saturday, September 9 at 10:00 AM. The prayer service is part of the annual National Day of Remembrance for Aborted Children, co-sponsored by Citizens for a Pro-Life Society, Priests for Life and the Pro-Life Action League. Members of the Delaware Knights of Columbus and other representatives of the pro-life community will be in attendance. The grace in Cathedral Cemetery holds the early remains of 63 aborted babies that were abandoned at a Chicago abortion facility and brought to Wilmington by Delaware Right to Life in December of 1988.

Ancey, the birthplace of Saint Francis de Sales, patron saint of the Diocese of Wilmington, is an alpine town in southeastern France, where Lake Ancey feeds into the Thiou River. It's known for its cobbled streets, winding canals, and pastel-colored houses. Rome, Italy's capital, is a sprawling, cosmopolitan city with nearly 3,000 years of globally influential art, architecture and culture on display, including ancient ruins such as the Forum and the Colosseum. It is the home of Vatican City, headquarters of the Roman Catholic Church, St. Peter's Basilica and the Vatican Museums, as well as the burial place of Blessed Pope Pius IX, the diocese's founder. Assisi is a hill town in central Italy's Umbria region. It was the birthplace of St. Francis, one of Italy's patron saints.

Primera lectura **1 REYES 19:9^a, 11-13A**

Salmo Responsorial 84: **“Muéstranos, Señor, tu misericordia y danos tu salvación”.**

Segunda lectura: **Romanos 9:1-5**

Evangelio Mateo 14:22-33

Se asustaron y gritaron de miedo, pensando que era un fantasma. La situación en la que se encontraban los apóstoles, en la travesía del lago, era una situación comprometida. En estas circunstancias es fácil entender que muchos cristianos se sientan tentados a pensar que Jesús es ya sólo un fantasma, un cuerpo sin vida que flota en el aire de nuestra débil creencia y que sirve ya más para asustar y amedrentar, que para consolar y dar ánimo. Por eso, debemos seguir leyendo el relato evangélico y escuchar con atención lo que Jesús dice a los discípulos.
