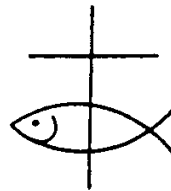
Lenten Penitential Fast & Abstinence

Days of Fasting & Abstinence: Ash Wednesday
& Good Friday

Days of Abstinence: All Fridays of Lent

To Fast means to eat only one full meal during that day. The other two meals should be smaller than the main meal. Also, no eating between meals. All persons ages 21 - 59 must fast on the required days.

To Abstain means to refrain from eating meat on the appointed day. All persons over the age of fourteen must abstain on required days.

The Gospel of John

After Easter we will begin to study the Gospel of John. Unlike the Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark and Luke), where we see more of the humanity of Jesus, in John, Jesus is a majestic figure, in control of his destiny at all times. John has a very black and white version of the world. The narrative can even be harsh and abrasive at times.

The Little Rock Scripture Series commentary helps us to be provoked, challenged and enlightened by the "deceptively simple" but "irony-laden" words and actions of the Gospel's characters.

We will break the study into 2 segments, Spring 2013 and Fall 2013. The Spring session begins Monday, April 8 and ends Monday, June 10. We will meet every Monday, except for Memorial Day, in Holy Angels Church Conference Room from 7:00 – 8:30 PM. There is a \$20 registration fee to cover class materials.

Prevention Health Screenings has been coming to our parish for the last 9 years. They offer 8 painless, non-invasive prevention screenings that could save your life. Test results are mailed to you, and you follow up with your own doctor.

Tests offered are:

1. Heart Disease Risk Screen via IMT
2. Stroke/Carotid Artery Screen
3. Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm Screen
4. Thyroid Screen
5. Peripheral Arterial Disease
6. Electrocardiogram (EKG)Screen
7. Pulmonary Function Screen
8. Bone Density-Osteoporosis

Lent

Lent is the season that prepares us to celebrate Easter. The main reason Lent is important is that Easter is more important. On Easter we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, whose passage beyond death into life offers redemption to believers. The resurrection is the cornerstone of Christian faith. The mystery of Christ's rising from the dead is so deep that the Church invites us to six weeks of preparation before we fully celebrate it. We call that period Lent.

For the faithful, Lent is a time of penitential practices and spiritual discipline. During this time we acknowledge our sins and seek God's help to overcome them. Traditionally, we engage in acts of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Together these actions show our dependence on God, our renunciation of the fascinations of this world, and our desire to better the lives of others.

For the Elect, those preparing for baptism, Lent is a time of intense spiritual preparation. They will celebrate baptism at Easter because in this sacrament they enter the mystery of Christ's dying and rising. They die to their former way of life and open their hearts fully to discipleship in Jesus. For the Elect, this is a season of purification and enlightenment. The prayers of this season help scrutinize and purify their intentions, removing whatever might block their commitment, and strengthening their resolve. They will become fully illumined with the light of Christ when they celebrate initiation at the Easter Vigil.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown before the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and abstinence. All the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat.
