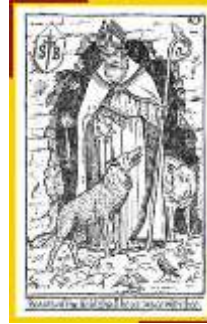

Older Catholics may remember St. Blaise Day – at liturgy, two blessed candles, held slightly apart, are pressed against the throat while the following blessing is said:

“Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness. In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.”

The traditional blessing of throats will take place at the 8:00 AM Mass at St. John Church and at the 10:00 AM School Mass on Wednesday, February 3rd.

Learn about the life of the first person born in our Diocese to have an official cause for canonization.

The Catholic Diocese of Wilmington has produced and released a short video on the life of Maryland Eastern Shore native, the Rev. Paul Wattson, SA, (1863-1940) – also known as Father Paul of Graymoor – who may be the first person born in what is now our Diocese, to be a canonized saint.

Father Paul was born in Millington, Maryland. He founded the Franciscan Friars of the Atonement, initiated the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity that we celebrate each January, started programs for the homeless and those who suffer from addiction, co-founded the Catholic Near East Welfare Association, published magazines, produced radio programs, and much more.

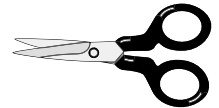

SEGUNDA LECTURA

1 Corintios 12: 31-13:13+ Evangelio: Lucas 4: 21-30
