## Silence in the Liturgy –

### Part 2 of 2

The GIRM (*General Instruction of the Roman Missal*) tells us we are

invited to silence at many different times.

First, we are told that **“even before the [liturgy] itself, it is praiseworthy for silence to be observed in church, in the sacristy, and in adjacent areas, so that all may dispose themselves for the sacred rites which are to be enacted in a devout and fitting manner”** (#45). The authors of the GIRM recognized that silence is difficult before a liturgy begins, because there are so many interactions and movement to make sure everything is prepared. However, we should focus the time before the liturgy to pray silence. This is why most churches now have a Gathering Space where we greet each other and may talk; there should always be a clear distinction of silence, at times accompanied by light music, once we enter the worship space.

Following the greeting at each liturgy, **the Presider invites each member of the Assembly to call to mind our sins and reflect on our need for repentance.** Such reflection during the Penitential Rite (or Act) needs to be done individually, and so we do so, briefly, in silence.

Several times during the Mass, the Presider precedes a prayer with the words “Let us pray...” **We then pause for a moment. Here we are being invited to recognize that we are in God's presence and to call to mind our own prayers at this time.** The Presider then prays a prayer on behalf of all of us called a “collect prayer.” During this prayer, the Presider “collects” all of our individual prayers into the one prayer he prays aloud.

**After each of the readings, the psalm, and the homily, we are given some more moments of quiet.** No, the lector, cantor, Presider, and organist haven't all fallen asleep! During this time we are to take in deeply what it is we have just heard or sung. The silence invites us to receive God's Word, grasping it with our hearts and make it our own (GIRM #56).

The last of the designated times for silence is after all have received Communion. As people are receiving the Eucharist, we are to symbolize our own union by singing together the Communion song, even after we, ourselves, have received Communion. **When the distribution of Communion is finished, we are then given time for private prayer, praise and thanks to God in our hearts** (GIRM #88). We are to silently prepare ourselves to go out and **be** the Eucharist to all whom we will meet this week.

We are grateful for the recognition of silence in our liturgies. For, with silence interspersed at various times during the liturgy, we are better able to hear, not just with our ears, but also with our hearts and whole selves, what God is saying to us today.
