

Together in the Spirit - A Pastoral Vision

Dear Parishioners,

This past Pentecost Sunday, May 15th, Bishop Malooly issued a pastoral letter to all Catholics of the Diocese of Wilmington presenting a pastoral vision for the future. He outlined the four Priorities which emerged out of the 2012 consultation with people/parishes of the Diocese.

The letter focused on priority #1, *Parish structure and leadership*, addressing a variety of parish leadership models. The Bishop identified three models of parish leadership: 1) Resident Pastor; 2) Linkage and 3) Parish Life Coordinator. The purpose of presenting these models is due to the shrinking number of priests to serve our parishes. These models should help “maximize the ministry of our clergy and to mobilize the gifts of all the baptized.”

In short, there are not enough priests to serve the number of parishes in the Diocese. There have been several parishes that have been linked, i.e. one Pastor for two or more parishes. This is not new in the Diocese. Parishes have been linked since the 1970’s. These are the parishes currently that have one pastor shared among two or more parishes.

- Cathedral of St. Peter – St. Patrick – St. Mary of the Immaculate Conception
- Holy Cross – Immaculate Conception
- St. Peter – Holy Spirit
- St. Matthew – Corpus Christi

Here at St. John-Holy Angels we are blessed with two worship sites and three priests in ministry. However, the needs of ministry go far beyond the boundaries of the parish. Our priests minister in a variety of parishes where there are less clergy to support the sacramental needs of the parishes. Bishop Malooly reminds us that our clergy are ordained to serve the diocese; we are not isolated as an enclave in Newark. Our priests respond to needs of other parishes. In any given week our priests might serve the sacramental needs of Holy Family or St. Margaret of Scotland, St. Thomas More Oratory, as well as parishes outside our Iron Hill Deanery.

The needs of our growing Hispanic community call our priests to Our Lady of Fatima, Holy Spirit, New Castle; St. Joseph, Middletown; St Dennis, Galena; St Agnes, Rising Sun. Bishop Malooly has asked us to respond to the pastoral needs of our people and we are happy to minister to the people of the Diocese. Spanish-speaking priests are few in the Diocese.


I Lectura Deuteronomio 30:10-14

Salmo Responsorial . Salmo 69 “Busquen al Señor, y revivirán sus corazones”.

II Lectura Colosenses 1:15-20

Evangelio Lucas 10: 27-37

El evangelio de hoy nos presenta la parábola del Buen Samaritano. Meditar una parábola es lo mismo que profundizar en la vida, para descubrir en ella los llamados de Dios. Al descubrir el largo viaje de Jesús hacia Jerusalén (Lc 9,51 a 19,28), Lucas ayuda a las comunidades a comprender mejor en qué consiste la Buena Nueva del Reino. Lo hace presentando a personas que vienen a hablar con Jesús y le plantean preguntas. Eran preguntas reales de la gente al tiempo de Jesús y eran también preguntas reales de las comunidades del tiempo de Lucas. Así, en el evangelio de hoy, un doctor de la ley pregunta: "¿Qué he de hacer para tener en herencia vida eterna?" La respuesta, tanto del doctor como de Jesús, ayuda a comprender mejor el objetivo de la Ley de Dios.



El samaritano de la parábola no pertenecía al pueblo judío, pero hacía lo que Jesús pedía. ¿Hoy acontece lo mismo? ¿Conoces a gente que no va a la Iglesia pero que vive lo que el evangelio pide? ¿Quién es hoy el sacerdote, el levita y el samaritano?
