**Missionary Visit
July 13/14**

Next weekend, we are pleased to welcome Father Miguel Caceres, TOR, to St. John-Holy Angels to introduce our parish community to the ministries of the Franciscan Friars of the Third Order Regular in Paraguay, South America.

Paraguay is one of the poorest and most isolated countries of South America. Widespread poverty, socio-economic inequality and limited natural resources are persistent challenges to Paraguay, yet the faith is vibrant and growing among the people. The Franciscans, TOR, have ministered in the country for over sixty years. They have established parishes and schools, community youth programs, as well as day care centers that provide meals for over five hundred needy children daily. They minister in urban areas and in the remote rural countryside where lack of industry and education has kept the campesinos impoverished.

As Father Miguel has written to us, "The Franciscans would like to continue with this work; the harvest is abundant but the workers are few. Our country is passing through a difficult political and economic situation where the gap between the rich and poor is widening more each day. These past few years have witnessed an internal migration as today in the countryside there is no option for the small farmer as there is no market for his products and the government is unable or unconcerned to find a solution. Today, as is often the case, the only credible institution is the Church. Our resources are limited and we count on the help of our brothers and sisters to advance our pastoral and evangelical work."

Father Miguel ministered at St. Paul Church, Wilmington, for several years in the 1980's. A second collection will be taken up at all Masses next weekend to assist in the ministry of the Franciscan Friars, TOR. Please be as generous as your means allow.

Holy Angels Church Entrance Doors

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Your donations over the past few years have allowed the Parish to significantly reinvest in its maintenance programs and emergency infrastructure projects, which were not always visible improvements. As a result of having handled most of the major projects, we can now turn our attention to other projects and improvements.

One of the visual needs of the Parish about which we have received some questions is the main entrance doors of Holy Angels Church. These exterior doors are made of wood, and after 9 years of use and weather, are visibly beaten.

Over time, the Parish has plans to replace ten of the exterior doors of Holy Angels Church with durable metal doors that look like the existing wooden doors. The first set of four doors, for the main entrance, will be ordered soon at a cost of \$13,000, which includes reusing the existing handles and hinges. The manufacturer requires a deposit of \$5,000 and once the new doors are ordered, it will take ten to twelve weeks to receive them. The new doors are insulated and will have a significantly longer lifespan than the existing wooden doors.

We are asking for your continued financial support toward purchasing these doors. We have other projects we would also like to accomplish over the next few months; however, when we order these doors, the cost will drain the remaining balance in the Building & Maintenance fund.

If you would like to help us purchase these doors, and are able to make a donation, simply put your donation in a plain white envelope and mark it "Entrance Doors". There are also some envelopes in the Gathering Space. You can drop your envelope in any collection basket. This would be greatly appreciated.

Children's Liturgy of the Word

Children's Liturgy of the Word has been a part of many parishes for decades. St. John the Baptist-Holy Angels Parish hopes to begin this program in the Fall of 2013 at the 9 AM Mass in Holy Angels Church.

Liturgy of the Word for Children is the practice of having the children leave the Sunday Assembly during the Liturgy of the Word and gather in a separate environment to engage in the Liturgy of the Word at a level more appropriate to the children's understanding. Their parents remain in the Sunday Assembly. The children return to their parent right before the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The purpose of making the liturgical experience more accessible to the assembled children is to nourish their faith experience and to affirm their value as important participants in the liturgy of God's Word.

Genuflection

A genuflection is the action begun from a standing position in which a worshiper moves his or her right foot back a step, drops the right knee briefly to the floor, and then stands upright again. Most people naturally bow their head while performing this action; some make the sign of the cross. Some hold onto a nearby pew for physical support. The purpose of genuflection is for the worshiper to honor Jesus Christ present in the Blessed Sacrament.

The priest genuflects three times at Mass. During the Eucharistic Prayer he genuflects after showing the consecrated bread to the people, and then after showing the cup. He genuflects again before announcing, "This is the Lamb of God." Taken together, his genuflections affirm the central belief about the Mass: during the Eucharistic Prayer, the Holy Spirit changes the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ; that food then becomes communion for the faithful.

Additional genuflections should be made in churches where a tabernacle containing the Blessed Sacrament is in the sanctuary. In those cases, the priest genuflects before and after Mass, and anyone passing in front of the tabernacle also genuflects to it. Since a tabernacle containing the Blessed Sacrament is commonly found in sanctuaries of Catholic churches, the faithful typically make a genuflection toward the tabernacle before entering and after leaving their place.

In churches where the tabernacle is not in the sanctuary, the faithful should instead bow to the altar before and after the service. Genuflection is directed not toward the altar, not toward the cross, not toward one's proximity to a pew, but to the presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. On Good Friday, though, at the close of the service, all genuflect to the cross.

Formerly it was customary to make a genuflection before a bishop and a double genuflection (both knees to the ground) when the Blessed Sacrament was exposed for adoration. These practices have been eliminated. A single genuflection is always appropriate before the Blessed Sacrament whether it is in the tabernacle or exposed in a monstrance; you may bow to a bishop if you wish.
