

2013 Newark Day Book Sale

Unfortunately, due to the hot weather and the last minute decision to hold the book sale on Newark Day with mostly last year's books, the sale only netted \$162.50. We especially appreciate Gary Heebner and Joe Wald for their invaluable help in setting up, hauling the 80+ boxes of books and 6 tables from the St. John Garage to the lawn in front of St. John Church in the 90 degree heat, and returning the leftover boxes to the garage at the end of the day. And thanks to Diane Heebner who kept a watchful eye on the sale, consolidating and reorganizing the books throughout the sale.

We have a number of boxes of books left. We decided to reduce the inventory as much as possible, so we are taking books to 2^{nd} & Charles to be sold. Any they don't take are being donated to another church for their July sale. Although the book sale did not produce a lot of revenue, the sale did bring many people onto the Church grounds. It was good to see the diversity of people and age groups who came in to check out the books or just enjoy some shade from the hot day. The event provides the Church with a good opportunity to interact with the Newark community.

Children's Liturgy of the Word



WHO: Children age 6 - 8 who have

not yet made their First Communion

WHEN: Coming Fall 2013**

9:00 AM Mass at Holy Angels Church

Children's Liturgy of the Word has been a part of many parishes for decades. St. John the Baptist–Holy Angels Parish hopes to begin this program in the Fall of 2013 at the 9 AM Mass in Holy Angels Church.

Liturgy of the Word for Children is the practice of having the children leave the Sunday Assembly during the Liturgy of the Word and gather in a separate environment to engage in the Liturgy of the Word at a level more appropriate to the children's understanding. Their parents remain in the Sunday Assembly. The children return to their parent right before the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The purpose of making the liturgical experience more accessible to the assembled children is to nourish their faith experience and to affirm their value as important participants in the liturgy of God's Word.

What is the purpose of these specific celebrations of the Liturgy of the Word at Mass? The Liturgy of the Word for Children has, as its name suggests, a threefold purpose. It is a time to:

- engage in the public, communal rituals of the Church (Liturgy)
- listen to, break open, and respond to the scriptures (Word)
- celebrate the word in a way that children may understand (Children).

It is expected that Children's Liturgy of the Word will mirror the general structure and purpose of the Liturgy of the Word celebrated by the adult Assembly, but with the proclamation and breaking open of the scriptures adapted to meet the developmental stage and abilities of children.

Consequently, it is not intended to be a Sunday school or Scripture class. It is not a time for religious education or catechetical instruction. It is, furthermore, best suited to children of primary school age (6 – 8 who have not received First Communion yet), who generally have the capacity to listen to, and gain some understanding, of God's word. A program for younger children is held at the same time through the Religious Education Office (call 302/731-2209 for more information).
