Dear Parishioners,

May the joy of the Risen Savior be with you during this Easter Season!

It is coming up on two years that I have been pastor of St. John-Holy Angels Parish. When I arrived in Newark in 2009, I recognized early on the wonderful ministries of our parish community. It was very apparent that our parish did not have a shortage of talented, giving, faith filled parishioners but we did have a shortage of financial resources to maintain and promote the mission of the Church in our parish.

About a year ago, we started to invite more parishioners to our ministries, especially for our Pastoral and Finance Councils. In the Fall, 2010 the Finance Council shared the parish financial condition with our 2,500+ families. At that time we published the GREEN REPORT in the Sunday Bulletin. There were mixed reactions to the distribution of that information. The Report communicated a sense of urgency that we had to pay serious attention to our growing financial challenges. During this past year we started to make short-term and long-term plans for expense reductions in order to put us on a path of greater accountability, disclosure and efficiency. After much deliberation with the Financial Council, I am excited to share with you a new program that will help sustain and even increase our parish finances.

The program is called **ONLINE GIVING**.

So what is **ONLINE GIVING** exactly? It is a program that allows parishioners to make their weekly, bi-weekly or monthly donations online, instead of dropping the donation into the collection basket. You might ask, "How will this change our financial condition?" It turns out that, on the average, parishioners miss about 15-17 weekly masses at St. John-Holy Angels due to vacation, travel or illness. At times parishioners do not "catch up" on their offertory pledge for the weeks missed. So **ONLINE GIVING** allows regular weekly contributions, including the weeks missed or when the offertory envelope is forgotten.

If most parishioners participate in the **ONLINE GIVING** Program, we could increase our annual donations by \$250,000 to \$300,000! Yes -- the impact could be that big!

With that increase in our Offertory contributions we could do many things: For instance:

- We could finally finish several conference rooms and meeting rooms at Holy Angels Church and Parish Center.
- We could set aside monies to repair and replace broken doors in our worship homes!
- We could finally finish renovating Holy Angels basement and Fremont Hall so that these spaces offer greater opportunities for community fellowship and renewal!
- We could complete the interior of Holy Angels Church as planned.
- We could begin to respond to the strategic needs of all parish ministries! Just imagine

We **can** improve our financial resources ... but it has to start with a vision and a plan to get there.

Starting next week, you will start to see flyers and bulletin inserts about this important **ONLINE GIVING PROGRAM**. The Finance Council has made this our #1 priority over the next 12 months! Rich Savona, Executive Officer of Finance Council, will be in charge of the program from a project management perspective. All Finance Council members will also be available to help you with questions about the Program.

Please join me in welcoming this new and exciting Program in our parish!

Roman Missal Update

Do these changes mean that the old translation was invalid and unorthodox?

No. The current translation was approved by conferences of bishops and confirmed by the Vatican, just like the one we will start using this November. Until the new text becomes effective, the current translation remains the valid ordinary form of the Liturgy in the Roman Rite. The revised translation attempts to address some of the inadequacies in the present translation by introducing a more elevated style of language and by retaining many poetic texts and scriptural allusions. The current translation fostered the faith of two generations of Catholics and retains a valid place in Church history—especially as the first attempt at a translation which brought us the celebration of the Liturgy in our own language. TODO CAMINO HUMANO PUEDE SER DIVINO

La liturgia de Pascua sigue poniendo ante nuestra consideración textos del libro de los Hechos de los Apóstoles, retazos de la vida de los primeros cristianos. Ya hemos visto cómo vivían todos unidos con un solo corazón y con una sola alma, cómo se ayudaban los unos a los otros en todo lo que podían, moral y materialmente. Sin embargo, hoy vemos que ya entonces hubo dificultades en la convivencia, roces entre unos y otros, opiniones encontradas. Entonces eran los cristianos de lengua griega contra los cristianos de lengua hebrea. No están conformes con su actuación y protestan, llegando a decir que es injusta, poco imparcial.

Los Apóstoles serán los encargados de dirimir la cuestión, serán los árbitros y jueces cuya decisión se aceptará incondicionalmente. Y como entonces, también luego, muchas veces a lo largo de los siglos, serán los sucesores de los Apóstoles, con el Papa a la cabeza, los que solucionen las cuestiones debatidas, los que digan la última palabra. A nosotros sólo nos queda aceptar con espíritu de fe lo que sea, estemos o no de acuerdo. Ante las quejas, los Apóstoles responden: "No nos parece bien descuidar la Palabra de Dios para dedicarnos a la administración. Por tanto, hermanos, escoged a siete de vosotros, hombres de buena fama, llenos de espíritu de sabiduría, y los encargaremos de esta tarea; nosotros nos dedicaremos a la oración y al servicio de la Palabra" (Hch 6, 2-4).

Era lo propio de ellos, rezar y predicar. Lo otro, el atender a los pobres, con ser una cosa muy buena, no era propiamente lo suyo. Ellos habían de tener tiempo para la oración y para proclamar el mensaje de Cristo. Por eso deciden que propongan a siete hombres de buen espíritu y de buena formación, para que atiendan al servicio de beneficencia. Son los primeros diáconos. Es digno de notar cómo son los Apóstoles los que les imponen las manos, consagrándolos para la misión que se les encomienda. El pueblo fiel sólo los propone, y eso porque los Apóstoles así lo determinan. Es un detalle más de la condición jerárquica, no democrática, de la Iglesia. Cristo mismo lo quiso así, y por mucho que soplen los aires de una fácil demagogia, la Iglesia no podrá cambiar sus estructuras, las que el Señor instituyó.
