Coupons for Commissaries

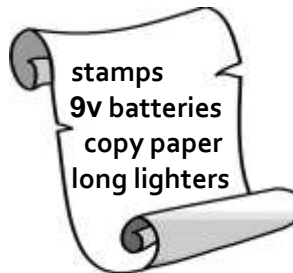
For military families who relocate overseas, the financial transition can be difficult. Enlisted Military Personnel and their families may find stretching their dollars a real challenge, even more so than those who are based in this country.

One way we can help is by saving expired or unused coupons and sending them to select commissary operations around the world. There are several military family support centers overseas who offer coupon exchanges. The military commissaries overseas accept manufacturer's cents-off coupons for up to six months past their printed expiration dates.

If you would like to participate, please clip coupons you would normally not use and deposit them in one of the marked collection receptacles at St. John The Baptist or Holy Angel Church, or forward your expired coupons (up to 4 months) to D. Maxwell, 14 West Ridge Court, Newark DE 19711.

The Mass Texts Are Changing?!



Over the past several years, you have heard much through newspapers, websites, and the news about the forthcoming revised translation of the **Roman Missal**.

You may be wondering, "What is the Roman Missal, and how does this affect me?" Take notice of the text that the priest recites most often during Mass.

These prayers come from the red book called the Sacramentary, which together with the Lectionary for Mass make up the Roman Missal. The missal is the collection of prayers, chants, and rubrics (instructions) used to celebrate Mass. This includes prayers such as the Sign of the Cross; Opening Prayers; Eucharistic Prayers, etc. The majority of the prayers we recite or sing at Mass are contained in this book and it is these prayers that were recently re-translated from the original Latin into English.

In the early Christian Church, many of the Mass prayers were memorized and handed down orally. Scribes eventually collected the prayers and recorded them in the "book of sacraments." With the invention of the printing press, Mass texts became standardized and published universally. The texts were translated into English after Vatican II and published in 1969. A major revision occurred again, and the second edition of the Roman Missal was published in 1975.

In 2001, Rome issued a document, *Liturgiam Authenticum*, which called for a more literal translation of the original Latin, and so a group of scholars, poets, and theologians convened and worked painstakingly on providing a third English translation.

The Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments granted *recognitio* (approval) on April 30, 2010, and presented the texts to Pope Benedict XVI. It is most likely that these texts will be implemented on November 27, 2011, the First Sunday of Advent 2011. For more information visit www.usccb.org/romanmissal/.
