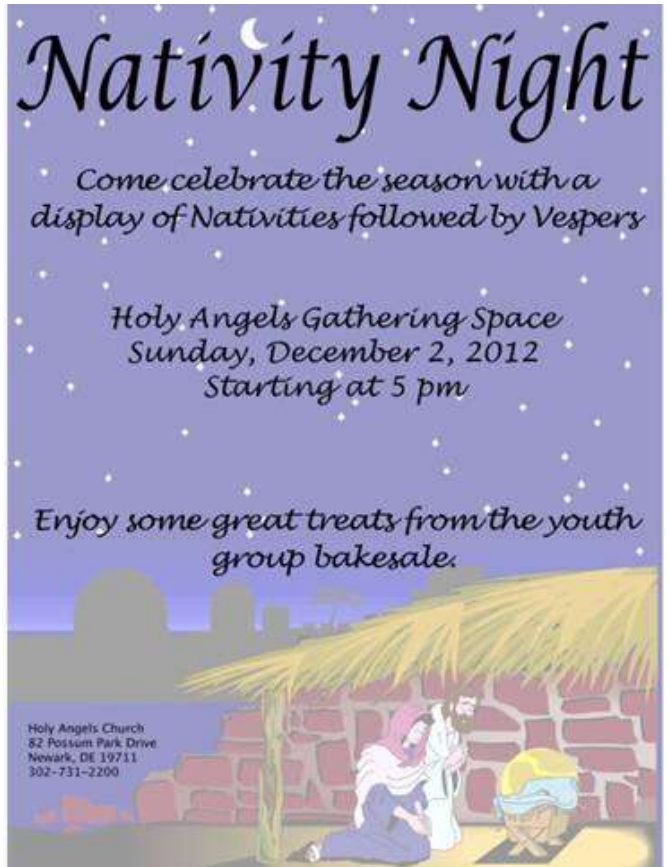

Lay Presiders – Albs

Advent is fast approaching. We will once again have Vespers on the Sunday evenings during Advent. We will be welcoming some new lay presiders during these liturgies.

In addition to the new presiders, there is another change you will notice. The lay presiders will be vested in albs. This most basic of liturgical vestments is a white robe, from the Latin word for white, *albus*. As is true for most liturgical vestments, the alb dates back to the early church and reflects the ordinary dress of the people of the time.

While we Catholics are used to seeing priests and deacons in colored vestments of green, purple, and red, the sight of a layperson in a white alb can be bit of a shock. The alb is basically the white garment we all received at Baptism. It signifies we have been made a new creation in Christ. For that reason any baptized person can wear an alb. It is good to bear in mind that the alb is not a mark of rank or virtue.

Here in our Parish we are making this change to be more in keeping with the Catholic tradition of wearing ritual clothing, as opposed to street clothes, to conduct the sacred action of prayer. Another advantage of lay presiders being vested in albs is the uniformity of clothing.

We also bear in mind that, vested or not, the lay presider is present seeking to humbly serve us, and to build up our community as they lead us in prayer. - Mary Consiglio
