Baseball Game 1 – April 11

The Holy Angels seize victory thanks to late single, drop the CTT Eagles 5-4!

The Holy Angels outlasted the CTT Eagles on Saturday after seven lead changes, squeaking out a 5-4 win at Christ the Teacher School. The Holy Angels pulled out the win thanks to a strong seventh inning, and went up for good on an RBI single by Zachary Pereira, bringing home Ricky Gannett.
