


Food Festival Help Wanted!

**Matsiko Orphan Choir to Perform
in a FREE Concert at Holy Angels
on August 14th – Host Families Needed**



The Matsiko Orphan Choir will perform a **FREE concert at Holy Angels Church (82 Possum Park Rd., Newark) on August 14th at 5:30pm.** The choir will also sing a few pieces at the 10:00 AM Liturgy at Holy Angels on the same day. This choir has sung for Google Inc., Disneyland, at the World Cup, for the LA Dodgers, for Presidents and other Heads of State and Government. A free will collection will be taken up at the end of the concert.

18 children from Peru, Liberia and India are currently touring the U.S. as a part of the Matsiko World Orphan Choir. The choirs have performed across the country in school assemblies, retirement homes, multicultural events, festivals, churches, markets and malls, corporate headquarters, and even professional sporting events, sharing a message of hope for the world’s 600 million orphaned and at-risk children.

Matsiko performs energetic and dynamic cultural dances in full vibrant costumes and sings primarily original songs. A Matsiko performance is a multicultural event that has been deemed a “world treasure” on the Disneyland Parks Blog.

We are looking for families to volunteer to house 2-4 kids and 1 chaperone for 2 nights. The choir provides their own air mattresses. Host families are responsible for providing a place to sleep at night (you DO NOT need to have a bed for each person you host. The children will share beds or sleep on air mattresses, couches or even blankets on the floor). The choir spends their days together, so we also ask that host families bring the children and chaperones to a central location each morning and pick them up again each evening. Holy Angels School Aftercare Program

The Aftercare Program at Holy Angels School provides after-school activities for students in grades Pre-K 3 through 8. The Program accepts job applications from persons from the age of 18 years that wish to work as counselors in the program. Among the range of counselor activities: supervise homework hour; develop and lead arts and crafts projects; organize indoor and outdoor games; coach performance arts such as singing and role playing.

Applicants must enjoy working with children in groups. Counselors are expected to take initiative to develop, organize, and implement new activities. Criminal background check is REQUIRED for all Counselors this check is good for 5 years. There is a fee which you would be responsible to pay.

Hours are 2:45 – 4:45 PM/ 2:45 – 5:15 PM/ 2:45 - 6:00 PM. Work schedule is flexible – you must be able to work a minimum of three (3) days per week. Wages are \$8.50 per hour.

XIX DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

I Lectura Sabiduría 18: 6-9

Salmo Responsorial . Salmo 33 “Dichoso el pueblo que el Señor se escogió como heredad”

II Lectura Hebreos 11: 1-2, 8-19

Evangelio Lucas 12: 32-48

El Evangelio de este domingo prolonga el tema del domingo pasado. Con palabras cariñosas, Jesús exorta a sus discípulos a confiar plenamente en Dios pero también les insta a mantenerse vigilantes esperando al Señor.

Debemos de recordar que la primera generación de cristianos esperaban con ansias la segunda venida de Cristo, su parusía; con el paso de los años esa fiebre se fue disipando, y cuando san Lucas escribe su Evangelio, quizás era la tercera o cuarta generación, poco quedaba de aquel entusiasmo inicial. Por eso vienen bien esas amonestaciones para aguardar la llegada del Señor.

La bienaventuranza a los que viven preparados a la venida del Señor tiene un resultado sorprendente: el señor les sirve, los vuelve señores. Esta inversión es el honor más grande que a un esclavo puede recibir. La paciencia y la perseverancia tienen su gran recompensa.

La parte dedicada a los líderes de la iglesia, personificados en la figura de Pedro, es muy severa. Los abusos y la flojera del administrador son severamente castigados, porque traicionan la voluntad del amo.
