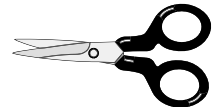

Evangelio Juan 1:29-34

Jesús es el "Cordero de Dios que quita el pecado del mundo". Esta confesión de fe de la comunidad cristiana tiene muchas cosas para decirnos; tomemos sólo una.

Las palabras reconocen el papel purificador de la sangre de Jesús respecto a la humanidad. Su trasfondo son los sacrificios del templo de Jerusalén, donde cada día era degollado sobre el altar, un cordero para borrar el pecado de Israel. El precio del cordero se pagaba con las aportaciones de los varones, los hijos de Israel. Las faltas o pecados a perdonar eran las transgresiones a los mandamientos de la Ley de Dios. Todo pecado quebranta la alianza con Dios y convierte al pecador en deudor, obligado a resarcir o pagar. Siendo de sangre la alianza con Dios, la vida era el precio.

Los cristianos confesamos que Cristo, el Cordero del sacrificio único y eterno, de Dios, pues no lo aportamos los humanos.

Por eso su Sangre derramada tiene validez eterna y purificatoria. Como nuevo pueblo de Dios, nuestra misión consiste en dar testimonio de la nueva alianza en Cristo.
