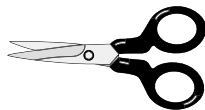

Primera Lectura: 1 Samuel 3: 3b-10, 19

Salmo Responsorial: 39 **“Aquí estoy Señor, para hacer tu voluntad”**.

Segunda lectura: I Corintios 6: 13-15, 17-20

Evangelio: Juan 1: 35-42

Hoy, es el segundo domingo del tiempo Ordinario, es el tercer domingo de testimonio de Juan Bautista. Lo da frente a sus discípulos. Ellos comienzan a seguir a Jesús Es el primer día de discipulado.
