Dear Parishioners,

Quite a few of you have inquired about what is still needed to complete the New Chapel and Conference area in the Holy Angels Church building. The basics: walls, ceilings, lighting, heating and air conditioning are near completion. But the monies for the outfitting of the new space is yet to be donated.

Some particular things that are needed are a microwave for the kitchenette and an 18 cubic ft. refrigerator for that space, totaling about \$1000 for both appliances. In the Conference Room we are in need of monies for tables, chairs, a flat screen 50 inch TV and a white board for the wall, all costing a total of about \$2000. In the chapel we are still in need of a 50 in. flat screen TV for the wall. And finally, the cost of carpeting the whole area for materials is \$7000.

Any help you might be able to give toward the completion of this much needed added space at Holy Angels is most appreciated. Please call the Parish Office, 731-2200, for more information.




Special Announcement!

As part of the Diocese of Wilmington's 150th anniversary celebration, a pilgrimage to Anney, Rome and Assisi will take place April 16 – 26, 2018. And you are invited!

Anney, the birthplace of Saint Francis de Sales, patron saint of the Diocese of Wilmington, is an alpine town in southeastern France, where Lake Anney feeds into the Thiou River. It's known for its cobbled streets, winding canals, and pastel-colored houses. Rome, Italy's capital, is a sprawling, cosmopolitan city with nearly 3,000 years of globally influential art, architecture and culture on display, including ancient ruins such as the Forum and the Colosseum. It is the home of Vatican City, headquarters of the Roman Catholic Church, St. Peter's Basilica and the Vatican Museums, as well as the burial place of Blessed Pope Pius IX, the diocese's founder. Assisi is a hill town in central Italy's Umbria region. It was the birthplace of St. Francis, one of Italy's patron saints.

Visitors for Christ

St. John Cemetery

Did you know that St. John-Holy Angels Parish has its own cemetery? If you didn't, you are not alone. Possibly because we don't often speak of it, and because of its geographical separation from the main parish campus, many parishioners are not aware it exists. Not only do we have one, but it has been a part of our parish since 1885. In 1885, Justin J. Pié, a parishioner and owner of the Deer Park Estate, donated an acre of land for a parish cemetery, located at 401 Elkton Road at the corner of Elkton Road and West Park Place. The cemetery was officially opened in 1892 and is still in use today. There are over 200 interments dating from 1892 and as recent as this year. If you drive by the corner of West Park and Elkton Road, you will notice a Historical Marker adjacent to the Cemetery Gate, identifying the grave of Major League Baseball Hall of Fame Member Victor G. Willis. And when you drive by, remember to say a prayer for all those buried here, and all the souls of the faithful departed.
