

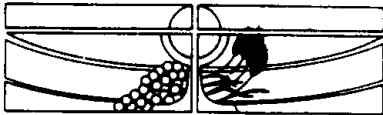

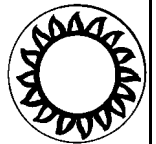

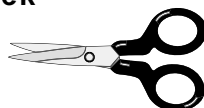

1 Lectura Ezequiel 2: 2-5

Evangelio Marcos 6: 1-6

En toda esta parte del evangelio se va distinguiendo entre los que pertenecen al “circulo de Jesús” y los que están ‘afuera”. Se nota que no toda la gente que sigue a Jesús está adentro. Los que tienen fe en él son pocos y el grupo de Jesús está aprendiendo lo que significa seguir a Jesús e involucrarse con el proyecto del reino. El episodio de la sinagoga tiene dos caras; la reacción de la gente, es una: “Y se escandalizaban por su causa” la otra es la de Jesús: “Y se admiraba de la incredulidad de ellos”.

El escándalo de los paisanos de Jesús surge porque lo conocen bien. El es un “*tekton*”, alguien que trabaja con las manos, madre, la piedra, techos, bardas, lo que sea. Pero que esas manos rudas operen prodigios..... Saben que no visitó ningún centro académico, pero explica las escrituras de manera tan clara..que ¡Es mejor rechazarlo! Como si sólo los privilegiados, los escogidos, tuvieran acceso al reino. Ese modo de pensar es lo que impide percibir la sabiduría y el poder de Dios operando en el día a día cotidiano y ordinario de cada paisano.
