### Paper Recycling

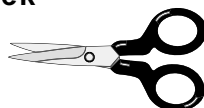

**1 Lectura Sabiduría 1: 13-15; 2: 23-24**  
**Salmo responsorial 29**  
**II Lectura 2 Corintios 8:7,99, 13-15**

**Evangelio Marcos 5: 21-43**

En el Evangelio de hoy están en juego la vida de dos mujeres: una con doce años padeciendo de una hemorragia (menorrea), y otra de doce años, moribunda. La hemorroísa sana ocultamente, ella no se atubo a lo consabido. Su deseo de salud la llevó a donde “no debía”. Violó las normas de pureza, con tal de sacudirse un sufrimiento tan callado como penoso. Pero Jesús la obliga a confesar su secreto. Ella teme, tiembla, cae de rodillas y confiesa la verdad que la ha salvado.

El proceso de vergüenza Jesús lo transforma en uno de liberación. Y salvación pública. La fe ha transformado a esta mujer. La ha vuelto atrevida. Ella ha puesto su esperanza de salud al tocar a Jesús; justo lo que no debía es lo que hace, y esto porque se trata de Jesús, se le revierte la salvación. Ahora es modelo para todo creyente.

La otra mujer es pura pasividad. La hija de Jairo está en edad casadera, doce años, y está bien protegida socialmente por su padre y su madre, y una red popular que les respalda (mensajeros y plañideras). Toda una vida por delante, “diría la gente”. Pero la muerte ya la tiene tomada hasta que Jesús la levanta de la mano.

En estos dos relatos de salvación femenina, la salud se comunica por contacto físico de Jesús (ver 5: 22-33). Es importante valorar la salud que Dios no da también por medio de contacto físico y sensible. *Así funcionan los sacramentos*, pero pensemos en nuestros padres, hermanos, hermanas, y en nuestros hijos e hijas. La calidez y el tacto son caminos para la fe y la salvación.
