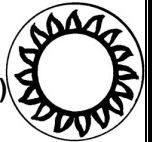

Pero es una compasión activa, que mueve a remediar el mal con lo que tiene a su alcance; y Jesús es el señor de la vida. La devolución del muchacho a su madre, indica que se lo da como apoyo social y sostén anímico.
