Dear Parishioners,
 Happy Easter!

During the Easter Vigil, shrouded in darkness we lit the Paschal Candle to remember the flame of Christ that lights our way. Throughout the fifty days of the Easter Season we celebrate His rising from the dead.

It is so amazing that we celebrate Easter when the Gospel reading from John proclaims that the only thing the disciples witnessed on that morning of the first day of the week was an empty tomb. They gazed into a place of death, a place of darkness. The disciples, Mary of Magdala, John and Peter, did not start their Easter journey with faith – they started with amazement, confusion, disbelief. They started, as John's Gospel said, when it was still dark and all they had and saw was an empty tomb. It wasn't much to go on and not much at all to believe in.

Yet, they did. Jesus simply was not there. Jesus was not dead.

The resurrection of Jesus Christ is not just another thing we believe; it is everything. St. Paul says it: "*if Christ has not been raised then our faith is in vain.*" Everything we believe hinges on the resurrection of Christ. The disciples almost missed it. Mary went to the tomb, saw the stone rolled away and left to get Peter and John. They looked in the empty tomb, and went home. If Mary of Magdala had not gone to the place of death, she would never have found life; if Peter and John had stayed home rather than look for the Lord, they would still be wondering about Jesus.

Mary, John, Peter, grew in their faith, in their awareness and in their response. They eventually "*saw and believed*": not Jesus dead, not Jesus not there, but Jesus risen and alive.

We will hear the Easter stories of Jesus again throughout the Easter Season. Some disciples could hardly recognize Him; some couldn't believe it was He; some missed Him. But when Jesus rose from the dead – He stayed risen – He walked among His disciples. Once He appeared, He did not disappear.

During the Easter Season when we sing, "*Jesus Christ is Risen Today,*" we don't mean only "Jesus Christ was raised once upon a time". We don't sing that. We mean that the Risen Christ is all around us, in the eyes and faces of those sitting beside us, in the bread and wine of the altar, in the newly baptized, and in the people we meet all the time.

He is alive today – teaching, healing, touching, suffering, dying and rising. If we go seeking the Risen Jesus with faith and hope and love we will find him in people around us. Then truly not only is Christ risen but we too are already living a risen life by His power and grace.



Bins from Newark Recycling will be available for all scrap metal items: save all your aluminum cans, soda, pet food, soup, tuna, canned vegetables, etc. The best way to check if it is aluminum is to hold a magnet to the can – if it does not stick, it's aluminum!

Aluminum must be kept separate because it will go into a different container.

All other cans and scrap metal will be deposited into another container together.

We will accept any metal items, including but not limited to: old lawnmowers (empty out gas/oil), washers, dryers, weights and weight benches, filing cabinets, metal desks, folding metal chairs, metal lawn furniture and tables without glass, aluminum siding, all scrap metal, cooper, iron, brass, steel stainless steel, and even car batteries.

The Gospel of John

After Easter we will begin to study the Gospel of John. Unlike the Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark and Luke), where we see more of

the humanity of Jesus, in John, Jesus is a majestic figure, in control of his destiny at all times. John has a very black and white version of the world. The narrative can even be harsh and abrasive at times.

The Little Rock Scripture Series commentary helps us to be provoked, challenged and enlightened by the "deceptively simple" but "irony-laden" words and actions of the Gospel's characters.

We will break the study into 2 segments, Spring 2013 and Fall 2013. The Spring session begins Monday, April 8 and ends Monday, June 10. We will meet every Monday, except for Memorial Day, in Holy Angels Church Conference Room from 7:00 – 8:30 PM. There is a \$20 registration fee to cover class materials.
