46% of Delaware abortions are performed on girls and women from out of state. Over 3,000 girls and women cross state lines each year—and we believe that many, if not most, of them are young girls seeking to evade parental consent laws in their home state of Pennsylvania.

COMMON GROUND

What to Say to Your Legislators About Why HB 80 Could Prevent Over 3,000 Abortions Each Year in Delaware

When you talk to your legislator, be polite and don't threaten. Following are some points you may wish to make:

- Delaware has the highest per capita abortion rate in the country.
- 46% of the girls and women having abortions here are from other states—states with strong parental consent laws—that's over 3,000 abortions a year from out of state.
- African-American women are victimized by abortion at three times the rate of white women.
- A strong parental consent law in Delaware could cut the number of abortions here by 3,000 or more—almost half.

Delaware has the weakest parental notification bill in the 50 states. It applies only to girls 15 and under, and it allows these young girls to bypass even caring parents by talking to a mental-health professional. We are amending this weak bill with HB 80.
