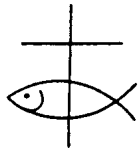

Days of Fasting & Abstinence: Ash Wednesday & Good Friday



Days of Abstinence: All Fridays of Lent

To Fast means to eat only one full meal during that day. The other two meals should be smaller than the main meal. Also, no eating between meals. All persons ages 21 – 59 must fast on the required days.

Lent

To Abstain means to refrain from eating meat on the appointed day. All persons over the age of fourteen must abstain on required days.

Maryland Crab Soup (quart) (comes frozen) \$10.00

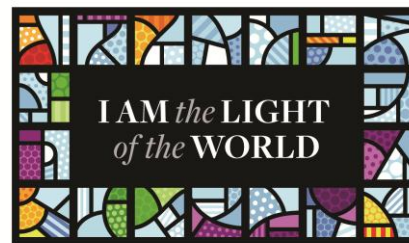

ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL 2011

In today's reading from the Gospel of John, we see a compassionate Jesus, a blind man who wants to see, and the Pharisees who are blind because they refuse to see the loving power of Our Lord.

Jesus is moved when he meets the man who has been blind since birth. He doesn't bother with questions about the man's affliction nor is he influenced by the critical opinions of the Pharisees. Jesus sees someone in need and takes immediate action to help that person.

Do you and I have the same sense of urgent compassion when we see someone in need? Maybe someone in our family, in our community or a complete stranger on the street? Do we have the eyes of Jesus when we see someone seeking comfort and understanding?

The Annual Catholic Appeal, with its theme, "*I Am the Light of the World*", invites each of us to help bring the Light of Christ into the lives of those who seek His love and protection. It is an opportunity for each of us to unite as a Catholic community and to reach out to serve others – the hungry, the homeless, the unemployed, the distressed, the unchurched, our children and the elderly.

What is the Roman Missal?

Take notice of the red book the priest uses at the altar during Mass. This book is called the *Sacramentary*, which together with the *Lectionary* make up the *Roman Missal*. The *Missal* is the collection of prayers, chants, and instructions (rubrics) used to celebrate Mass. In the early Christian Church, many of the prayers were memorized or handed down by oral tradition. Scribes eventually collected the prayers and recorded them in *liber sacramentum* (book of sacraments or sacramentaries) and books used for Scripture readings and chants. Eventually all of these were compiled into a single volume, the *Missale Plenum* (complete Missal). When Gutenberg invented the printing press in 1470, Mass texts became standardized and published universally. In 1474, the first *Missale Romanum* (Roman Missal) was printed in Latin and changed many times over the next five centuries. Because of the increase in Scripture proclaimed after Vatican II, the *Missal* was divided back into the *Lectionary* and *Sacramentary*. With the new translation, we will retain the original title of the book, *Roman Missal* with the rest of the world. Our brothers and sisters in our own Hispanic Community have been using the *Misal Romano* for many years, which is the translation that comes from the Mexican Conference of Bishops.
