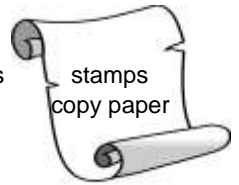
Silent Prayer Community

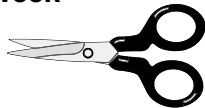
**A Vocation Reflection

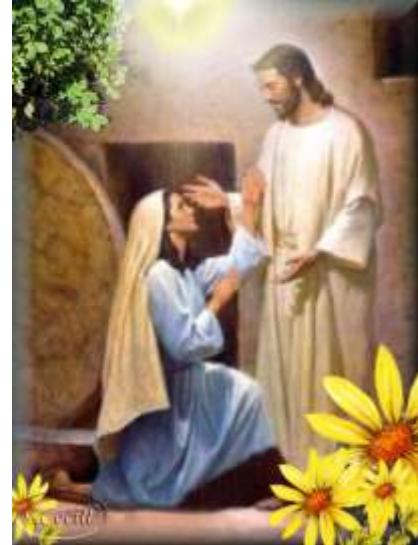
