National Day of Remembrance for Aborted Children Saturday, September 9

You are invited to attend a prayer service at the graveside of aborted children at Cathedral Cemetery, 2400 Lancaster Avenue in Wilmington, on Saturday, September 9 at 10:00 AM. The prayer service is part of the annual National Day of Remembrance for Aborted Children, co-sponsored by Citizens for a Pro-Life Society, Priests for Life and the Pro-Life Action League. Members of the Delaware Knights of Columbus and other representatives of the pro-life community will be in attendance. The grace in Cathedral Cemetery holds the early remains of 63 aborted babies that were abandoned at a Chicago abortion facility and brought to Wilmington by Delaware Right to Life in December of 1988.

Important information for Low-Income Families

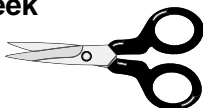

The SFSP was established to ensure that low-income children continue to receive nutritious meals when school is not in session. Free meals, that meet Federal nutrition guidelines, are provided to all children, 18 years old and under, at approved SFSP sites in areas with significant concentrations of low-income children. "The Liturgy of the Eucharist"

The New Testament accounts of the Last Supper highlight certain foundational actions of Jesus at the meal he shared with his Apostles on the occasion of the Passover. Toward the beginning of the meal proper he (1) took bread; (2) gave thanks; (3) broke bread; (4) took a cup of wine; (6) gave thanks; (7) and shared the cup with those present. The early Christian community, aware of Jesus's command that his followers break bread and share the cup "in memory" of him, continued these actions of Jesus and did so within a meal, at first a Jewish meal with its traditional prayers and rituals. Although it is highly likely that the Last Supper was a Passover meal, there is no evidence that the Christian celebration of the Eucharist retained the ritual form of the Passover meal, much less its occurrence only once a year.

As the Liturgy of the Eucharist developed, a number of factors were soon to exert great influence upon the structure of the Eucharistic celebration. First, there were practical reasons why a meal could not be served every week with large crowds, there were also abuses of the meal taking place (I Corinthians 11:18), plus the Christian meal was becoming mixed with signs of a former pagan meal. As a consequence, the Eucharistic part of the meal (bread and cup rites where Christ attached a new meaning to himself) were removed from the entire meal and celebrated before or after the entire meal. A process of simplifying the meal took place in where the bread and wine were "taken", placed on the table together, a prayer of thanksgiving was said and it was distributed. This four-action shape of the Eucharist is what seems to have evolved over time to what we have today.

Food Festival Donations Needed

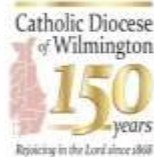

Rome, Italy's capital, is a sprawling, cosmopolitan city with nearly 3,000 years of globally influential art, architecture and culture on display, including ancient ruins such as the Forum and the Colosseum. It is the home of Vatican City, headquarters of the Roman Catholic Church, St. Peter's Basilica and the Vatican Museums, as well as the burial place of Blessed Pope Pius IX, the diocese's founder. Assisi is a hill town in central Italy's Umbria region. It was the birthplace of St. Francis, one of Italy's patron saints.
