“Presentation of the Gifts”

One of the most ancient customs of the Church is that of the people themselves providing the bread and wine for the Eucharist. In third century Rome the deacons carried and presented to the bishop the gifts brought by the faithful. It has been suggested that by the next century, the people processed to special tables where they put the gifts before they were processed up. In the seventh century, the Pope received the bread from the rich citizens, his assistants collected more bread from the people and deacons collected the wine. As the Roman Liturgy developed in other lands, this rite became a true procession of all the people but not only of bread and wine, but of oil, candles, wheat, grapes, and other items of precious value. Since this procession was a counterpart of the Communion procession in which the transformed bread and wine were received back, those who presented the gifts were expected to receive the Eucharist. This principle still stands today – those who bring the gifts up in procession should be the ones who receive it back in Communion.

Later in time, the procession included money for the poor. Today we still bring forth the bread, wine, and gifts for the church and for the poor as we show our sign of participation in the Eucharist and in the social mission of the Church.

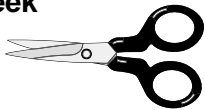
