Registration Procedure:

All athletes need to be registered with CYM (Catholic Youth Ministry). The website is www.cdow.org. Scroll down the left hand column and click on "youth". Click on "athletics". Click on "online registration".

If you are a new user, click on request user name and password and fill out the information. CYM will email you a password within a few hours. After receiving your username and password, fill out the registration. CYM will then send you the 2010/2011 form that needs to be turned in to the Coach on or before the first practice.

If you are not a new user, enter your user name and password. Click on "edit my information" and change grade and/or any other information that needs to be updated. CYM will email you the updated 2010/2011 form. Print and bring this form to the Head Coach on or before the first night of practice. Athletes cannot practice without this form. Please make sure the "primary affiliation" reads "Holy Angels".
