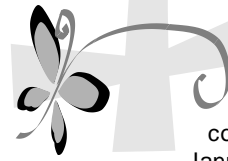

Liturgy During Cold/Flu Season

As always, we are reminded to use common sense in the reception of Holy Communion from the Cup during the annual cold and flu season. Likewise, if you are feeling ill or think you may have been exposed to a virus, please refrain from partaking of the Blood of Christ from the communal cup and offering your hand to others at the Sign of Peace. A simple nod or wave of the hand instead of a handshake is sufficient for the Sign of Peace if you are feeling ill. The obligation to attend Sunday Mass does not apply to those who are seriously sick, especially those who suffer from a contagious disease. So, please use your best judgment in deciding to remain home when suffering from flu-like symptoms. If you are home-bound or seriously ill for an extended period of time, please call the Parish Office, 731-2200, to arrange for one of our Visitors for Christ to bring Holy Communion to you.

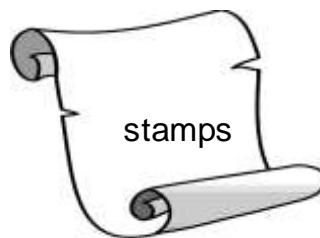

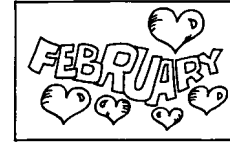

Box Tops for Education, Campbell's Soup labels and printer cartridges are also being collected to generate revenue for the School. Thank you for your contributions!

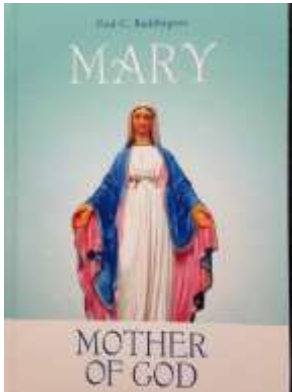


Not Yet Confirmed?

Visitors for Christ

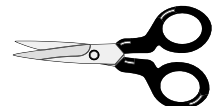
Visitors for Christ are men and women commissioned by the parish to serve and minister to the sick, the convalescing, the elderly and the homebound of our parish family.

IV Domingo Ordinario

Primera Lectura: Deuteronomio 18: 15-20

Salmo Responsorial: 94 “Ojalá escuchen hoy la voz del Señor: “No endurezcan el corazón”

Segunda lectura: I Corintios 7: 32-35

Evangelio: Marcos 1:21-28

La lectura de hoy, es una continuación del Domingo pasado y debe de ponerse a la misma luz. El cristiano puede vivir su pertenencia a Dios en cualquier estado de vida que haya elegido, ya sea el del matrimonio o el del celibato. Pero el sugiere que para predicar la Buena Nueva, es preferible ser célibe porque está más apropiado para esta misión, porque el celibato no tiene las exigencias del matrimonio. Pablo es realista, el esfuerzo para agradar al Señor que aquí consiste en predicar la Buena Noticia, pasa por los deberes de esposos para agradarse. Esto exige tiempo y está bien; es la ordenanza de Dios al amor de los esposos.

En el Evangelio: La sinagoga es el lugar de reunión del pueblo para honrar a Dios; es un espacio de santidad comunitaria y un pilar de ella es la enseñanza del reino. El exorcismo nos dice en que consiste el reino: destruir la impureza. La santidad de Dios no es otra cosa que su presencia cercana y liberadora, no autoritaria y esclavista. Una comunidad dominada por los espíritus de impureza y por las enseñanzas incluyentes.

El Evangelio es el camino nuevo para renovar la experiencia del reino de Dios entre nosotros y en nuestros lugares de reunión.
