Responsorial Psalm

We often call the responsorial psalm the "response" to the first reading. That's true, but it's really "responsorial" since it has a

responsory—a refrain that occurs with each verse.

The psalm is indeed a response or a comment on the first reading. In ordinary time, the Gospel text we hear falls in the Bible somewhere between last Sunday's Gospel passage and next Sunday's Gospel. The first reading leaps from some place in the Old Testament because its theme resembles the Gospel. The psalm echoes the reading we just heard. It's sort of a grandchild to Sunday's Gospel.

In the Book of Psalms, very few psalms have a refrain. (See Psalms 46 and 67, for example.) But on Sundays we treat them all alike. We give them refrains, and we put them in the mouths of our assemblies, often changing them into first person.

The refrains that appear in the lectionary, incidentally, are part of the official texts of the Mass. The verses are drawn from another translation. Refrains do not always match the wording in the verses.

You may ask...Why doesn't the psalm we sing always match the hymnal? We have quite a bit of freedom with the psalm. Since psalms were written as songs, the church urges us to sing them at every Mass. But because some assemblies struggle with new music, they can learn one or a few psalms for a whole season. Although easier to sing, their rapport with the first reading may suffer. If we substitute, it's important to replace the psalm with a psalm. It's really not supposed to be a popular hymn, or even a song with a refrain that's drawn from, say, one of the epistles.

The reason has to do with how Christians use psalms. Jesus, a good Jew, surely prayed them daily. Many passages of the New Testament quote the psalms to show their fulfillment in the life of Christ. And they have proven useful for prayer in virtually every culture and age of history.

We also have freedom to change the structure of the psalm. It doesn't have to be responsorial. We can sing it all together, like a hymn.

Listen carefully to the first reading and figure out its connection to the psalm. Then we can really pray the psalm while we sing.

Holy Angels Church Entrance Doors

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Your donations over the past few years have allowed the Parish to significantly reinvest in its maintenance programs and emergency infrastructure projects, which were not always visible improvements. As a result of having handled most of the major projects, we can now turn our attention to other projects and improvements.

One of the visual needs of the Parish about which we have received some questions is the main entrance doors of Holy Angels Church. These exterior doors are made of wood, and after 9 years of use and weather, are visibly beaten.

Over time, the Parish has plans to replace ten of the exterior doors of Holy Angels Church with durable metal doors that look like the existing wooden doors. The first set of four doors, for the main entrance, will be ordered soon at a cost of \$13,000, which includes reusing the existing handles and hinges. The manufacturer requires a deposit of \$5,000 and once the new doors are ordered, it will take ten to twelve weeks to receive them. The new doors are insulated and will have a significantly longer lifespan than the existing wooden doors.

We are asking for your continued financial support toward purchasing these doors. We have other projects we would also like to accomplish over the next few months; however, when we order these doors, the cost will drain the remaining balance in the Building & Maintenance fund.

If you would like to help us purchase these doors, and are able to make a donation, simply put your donation in a plain white envelope and mark it "Entrance Doors". There are also some envelopes in the Gathering Space. You can drop your envelope in any collection basket. This would be greatly appreciated.

Supermarket Gift Card Program

INTRODUCING... Children's Liturgy of the Word



WHO: Children age 6 – 8 who have not yet made their First Communion

WHEN: Coming Fall 2013**
9:00 AM Mass at Holy Angels Church

Children's Liturgy of the Word has been a part of many parishes for decades. St. John the Baptist-Holy Angels Parish hopes to begin this program in the Fall of 2013 at the 9 AM Mass in Holy Angels Church.

Liturgy of the Word for Children is the practice of having the children leave the Sunday Assembly during the Liturgy of the Word and gather in a separate environment to engage in the Liturgy of the Word at a level more appropriate to the children's understanding. Their parents remain in the Sunday Assembly. The children return to their parent right before the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The purpose of making the liturgical experience more accessible to the assembled children is to nourish their faith experience and to affirm their value as important participants in the liturgy of God's Word.

What is the purpose of these specific celebrations of the Liturgy of the Word at Mass? The Liturgy of the Word for Children has, as its name suggests, a threefold purpose. It is a time to:

- ❖ engage in the public, communal rituals of the Church (Liturgy)
- ❖ listen to, break open, and respond to the scriptures (Word)
- ❖ celebrate the word in a way that children may understand (Children).

It is expected that Children's Liturgy of the Word will mirror the general structure and purpose of the Liturgy of the Word celebrated by the adult Assembly, but with the proclamation and breaking open of the scriptures adapted to meet the developmental stage and abilities of children.

Consequently, it is not intended to be a Sunday school or Scripture class. It is not a time for religious education or catechetical instruction. It is, furthermore, best suited to children of primary school age (6 – 8 who have not received First Communion yet), who generally have the capacity to listen to, and gain some understanding, of God's word. A program for younger children is held at the same time through the Religious Education Office (call 302/731-2209 for more information).
