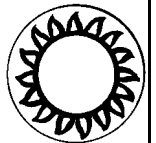

**Papal Visit to Philadelphia**

Pope Francis is coming to Philadelphia September 26 and 27, 2015 during the World Meeting of Families. On September 27<sup>th</sup>, Pope Francis will celebrate Mass at 3:00 PM on the Benjamin Franklin Parkway in front of the Philadelphia Art Museum.

**Many people have asked if the parish will provide a bus to the Papal Mass on September 27<sup>th</sup>.**

We have been advised that security is going to be very tight. Anyone attending the Mass will go through full security, at quite a distance from the center of the ceremonies. *Five thousand buses* will be parked in satellite parking lots miles away from the downtown area. The sports stadiums in South Philadelphia will be used for this parking as well as other venues. It is assumed that the participants in the Papal Mass will have to take public transportation from the parking lots to the Parkway.

St. John-Holy Angels will **NOT** have a bus going to Philadelphia for September 26 and 27. We are encouraged to use public transportation both to and from Philadelphia since we are close by. Using public transportation will bring participants closer to the Parkway than renting a bus. There will be extensive walking to get to the site of the Mass.

The city is expecting two million people for these two days. SEPTA is providing day passes for September 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> as was announced last week at Mass.

## Genuflection

A genuflection is the action begun from a standing position in which a worshiper moves his or her right foot back a step, drops the right knee briefly to the floor, and then stands upright again. Most people naturally bow their head while performing this action; some make the sign of the cross. Some hold onto a nearby pew for physical support. The purpose of genuflection is for the worshiper to honor Jesus Christ present in the Blessed Sacrament.

The priest genuflects three times at Mass. During the Eucharistic Prayer he genuflects after showing the consecrated bread to the people, and then after showing the cup. He genuflects again before announcing, "This is the Lamb of God." Taken together, his genuflections affirm the central belief about the Mass: during the Eucharistic Prayer, the Holy Spirit changes the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ; that food then becomes communion for the faithful.

Additional genuflections should be made in churches where a tabernacle containing the Blessed Sacrament is in the sanctuary. In those cases, the priest genuflects before and after Mass, and anyone passing in front of the tabernacle also genuflects to it. Since a tabernacle containing the Blessed Sacrament is commonly found in sanctuaries of Catholic churches, the faithful typically make a genuflection toward the tabernacle before entering and after leaving their place.

In churches where the tabernacle is not in the sanctuary [such as Holy Angels], the faithful should instead bow to the altar before and after the service. Genuflection is directed not toward the altar, not toward the cross, not toward one's proximity to a pew, but to the presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. [At St. John's it is appropriate to genuflect toward the altar since the Tabernacle is located behind the altar.] On Good Friday, though, at the close of the service, all genuflect to the cross.


Formerly it was customary to make a genuflection before a bishop and a double genuflection (both knees to the ground) when the Blessed Sacrament was exposed for adoration. These practices have been eliminated. A single genuflection is always appropriate before the Blessed Sacrament whether it is in the tabernacle or exposed in a monstrance.

1 Lectura 2 Reyes 4: 42-44

Salmo Responsorial 144

“Abres tú la mano, Señor, y nos sacias”.

II Lectura Efesios 4: 1-6

Evangelio Juan 6: 1-15

La liturgia nos lleva al evangelio de san Juan. El Episodio de hoy lo conocemos como “La multiplicación de los panes”, aunque los peces también fueron prodigados. Dos elementos del relato nos hacen entender que se trata de una señal. Primero el nombre del lago y, segundo, la fecha.

San Juan evoca la figura del emperador romano Tiberio César, cuando da el nombre del lago. Era la autoridad máxima, representante de los dioses en la tierra y padre y protector de todos los habitantes del imperio. El tradicional lago o mar de Galilea, había sido rebautizado por las autoridades para estar a tono con la ideología reinante y la pujanza socio-económica impulsada en la zona. Notable en las ciudades de los alrededores y en la explotación pesquera del lago. Pero el panorama que se presenta ante Jesús no corresponde a uno de abundancia, sino de escasez para las gentes, enfermedades, ignorancia y hambre. Mucha gente sigue a Jesús por haber visto las señales que hace en los enfermos. El otro elemento de la señal es la fecha del episodio: estaba próxima la Pascua de los judíos. Sorprendentemente Jesús no va a Jerusalén como lo hace en otras fiestas de peregrinación, a celebrar la libertad del pueblo judío, como estaba estipulado. Por el contrario se va al monte, y como si fuera poco la gente sigue a Jesús y no lo mandado en la ley de Moisés. Quizá Juan nos quiere llevar a otro universo, a que hagamos otra Pascua..y con pan de los pobres. Las comunidades de los primeros cristianos entendieron esta señal en clave del maná y de la Eucaristía, alimento que Dios provee a su pueblo.
