We are pleased to offer new programs this year in foreign language and also the expansion of our early childhood program with a new "Pre/K 3 yr. old class" being added. The building will undergo some renovations this summer to adequately house our younger children, and the library will be moved to another venue as a "media center". Each area of the School will be reconfigured and structured so that the various developmental/age group levels are clustered together within wings of the building....primary, intermediate and middle school.

Our faculty members meet the requirement of Delaware Teacher Certification and many have Masters' levels and beyond in the area of professional growth. We are also accredited by the Middle States Association of Elementary Schools.

A special thanks to our Grant Writing Committee and the efforts of Mrs. Colette Matsanka, Mrs. Marie Maiura, and Mr. Ralph Colasanti, who assisted in composing a grant that will be given to the School in the amount range (\$5000 - \$7000) through collaboration with the Cooperative Extension at the University of Delaware. Request for Stopyra Tract Rezoning

from S (Suburban) to CR (Regional Commercial)

Presentation & Discussion

The New Castle County Land Use Department has received a preliminary plan for a shopping center to be developed on 55 acres of the Stopyra Tract at Possum Park Road and Capitol Trail (Route 2), directly across from Holy Angels. The Ordinance for this action was formally introduced to New Castle County Council at its meeting on Tuesday, May 10, 2011.

In the 2007 revision of the NCCo Comprehensive Plan (Comp Plan 07), this entire 170+ acre tract is shown as low density residential (2 – 3 units/ac.), while in the NCCo Unified Development Code (UDC) which is used to **implement** the Comp Plan, it is zoned S (Suburban). The rezoning proposal **suggests** a 340,000 square foot shopping center with a line of stores set parallel to Possum Park Road, two restaurants and a bank. However, rezoning of the 55 acres, if it is allowed, does not **guarantee** this use of the land since CR allows a wide range of other commercial uses. The proposal must pass through several steps before a final vote by New Castle County Council, probably in early Fall 2011. These approaching steps will be outlined at this meeting.

The developer's representative will present the plan to those attending, and has agreed to respond to questions from the audience.

Following the presentation and questions, audience discussion will continue will representatives of Holy Angels Parish and Citizen Advocacy Possum Park Area (CAPPA), who are jointly sponsoring this meeting.

This will provide an excellent opportunity for you, your friends and your neighbors to learn about the proposed rezoning and the likely impacts on you and your community.

LA GRAN NOTICIA: DIOS NOS AMA ENTRAÑABLEMENTE

Mensaje universal. La primera persecución de los cristianos comenzó en Jerusalén contra el grupo de los helenistas, en especial contra sus dirigentes. Felipe huía a Samaria para escapar al control del sanedrín. Los apóstoles siguen de lejos la obra de Felipe, se sienten responsables de la marcha del cristianismo y están preocupados. Por eso envían a dos delegados, Pedro y Juan. Para comprender el sentido de esta visita, no debemos olvidar las tensiones entre los dos partidos, "hebreos" y "helenistas" en el seno de la comunidad primitiva de Jerusalén. La "imposición de manos" y la "oración sobre los fieles" constituyen el signo sacramental de la comunicación del espíritu. Con este gesto los apóstoles reconocen y confirman la obra de Felipe y celebran la unión de todos los cristianos en un mismo espíritu. Se dan cuenta de que el mensaje de Jesús es universal, para todos los hombres.

Dar razón de la propia esperanza en medio de la incompreensión. La fe exige ser testimoniada. La Primera Carta de Pedro trata de animar a los cristianos que se sienten perseguidos. Su contenido, más que una argumentación teórica, es una vivencia. Es deseable para ello un clima de búsqueda o de diálogo. La fe no se impone, dirá Benedicto XVI, sino que se propone. Previamente deberá existir esa experiencia de Jesucristo, que naturalmente estará teñida de peculiaridades personales. La experiencia de fe en Jesucristo nos dará fuerza para soportar las incompreensiones y padecimientos por hacer el bien. Al final triunfará el bien... Un mensaje que debe sostener también la esperanza de los cristianos del siglo XXI en medio de ambientes hostiles a la fe.

Una fe vivida en el amor y un amor operante por la puesta en práctica de la Palabra del Señor. Numerosos santos han subrayado en sus escritos este aspecto. "Ama y haz lo que quieras" (San Agustín). Jesús les dice que no les dejará solos cuando El se vaya, les enviará el Paráclito, el Espíritu de la verdad. Cristo vive en la fe de los que le aman.
