**More on
the Revised Roman Missal**

"Are changes being made to the celebration of Mass?"

Actually, no, it is not the celebration of Mass that is changing. All of the parts and the *Order of the Mass* as we know it will stay the same—and there will be no changes to the readings we hear at Mass. However, some of the words that are used in the prayers said by the priest and some of the responses of the people are changing. This is because the English translation of the revised third edition of the Roman Missal (*Missale Romanum*) has been approved and is ready for publication. The Roman Missal is the ritual text for the celebration of Mass currently referred to as the Sacramentary, the book used by the priest at Mass. The revision in the wording of prayers, acclamations, and responses was made to reflect a truer translation in English of the original Latin text in this third edition of the Roman Missal. Many of the revisions are also more deeply rooted in Scripture.

For example, currently, when the priest says "The Lord be with you," the Assembly responds: "*And also with you.*" With the new translation, the Assembly will respond: "*And with your spirit.*" Why? Because this is a truer translation of the Latin "*Et cum spiritu tuo.*" In fact, English is the only language which did not translate the word *spiritu*. Some examples: "*E con il tuo spiritu.*" "*Et avec votre esprit.*" "*Y con tu espíritu.*" The reference to the Spirit refers to the presence of the Holy Spirit, sealed in the priest at ordination, allowing him to celebrate the Eucharist in Christ's name.

These changes probably won't take effect until Nov. 2011. But they're coming! And it's time to prepare. For more information visit www.usccb.org/romanmissal/.
