There were lots of challenges this first year—some record big ones like 8 heat waves and stink bugs! But the gardeners persevered and worked very hard to keep the garden healthy and productive. Over the summer, a total of \$278 was presented to our St. Vincent DePaul Society from the produce exchange that spanned 9 weekends. Lots of gardening experience was gained and lessons learned. A big “thank you” to all the gardeners; to contributors of money, time, sweat, equipment, tools and expertise. And, last but not least, to Fr. Fiore for approving the project and Fr. Ralph for the garden blessing, which got us off to a great start.

A Message from the Building & Maintenance Ministry

New Information

During the past couple of weeks our Parish has suffered some damages and incurred some major and unexpected repair costs. First, the roof at St. John Church sprung a leak during the heavy rains we had recently. The repairs to the roof will take two days to complete and will occur during the week of October 25th.

Next, on the southeast side of Holy Angels School, a sinkhole developed and caused the sidewalk to cave in. This also was due to the recent weather conditions we experienced. That repair will occur as soon as ground conditions allow.

It was also brought to our attention that there were children playing around the open pit area of the chiller unit for the air conditioner located behind Holy Angels Church. This brought up some serious safety concerns. A decision was made to install a fence around the top of the wall surrounding the chiller unit to prevent a child (or any person) from falling and injuring themselves.

All these repairs were unexpected, but necessary, and it caused our parish substantial and additional costs. Your help and financial support for the upkeep of your parish is always greatly appreciated.

Completed Projects

Other scheduled repairs have been taking place as funds allowed. For example, the sidewalk and handicap entrance located in the small back parking lot on the northeast side of Holy Angels School has been replaced. The sidewalk was badly deteriorated and needed to be replaced.

The parish garage building and roof was also badly deteriorated and was desperately in need of repair. Those repairs were made and the work was completed on October 4th.

The area from the portico to the driveway turnaround in front of Holy Angels Church entrance at night was very dark. For safety reasons, lights were installed high above the entrance on the front of the portico as you enter the church to light up that entire area.

A new walkway ramp was also installed on the Holy Angels School Pre-K building.
