### "Learning a New Musical Mass Setting"



In the Roman Catholic Liturgy, composers, Catholic and non-Catholic alike, for hundreds of years have considered it the pinnacle of their career to have composed and performed a setting of the Roman Catholic Mass.

Composers such as Bach, Beethoven, Mozart, Brahms, and tons more have had their Masses composed and performed throughout the world. Even today, contemporary composers set the post Vatican II Liturgy to music.

After Bach's Mass in B Minor was performed for many years, it came time for a new setting, so Beethoven came along and composed his Mass in C Major. Even today, our Mass settings have been refreshed with the 2010 revision of the Roman Missal. In our parish we have learned three new/revised Mass settings in that time period. Learning a new musical Mass setting provides an opportunity for liturgical renewal and musical renewal in our parish every few months.

The new Mass setting that we have learned over the past few months is called "Mass of Joy & Peace" by composer Tony Alonso. We have not learned a new musical setting in over 18 months, so the learning of a new setting helps keep our celebration of the liturgy "ever ancient, yet ever new." While the process of learning a new Mass setting can be tedious, eventually, with practice, we will all get the hang of it and sing with full *gusto* and energy.

Thank you for your patience and for always participating in song and voice at every one of our Liturgies. Sung participation is very rare at Catholic Masses and I am very happy that is not the case at this parish! I am always happy to help lead an Assembly of beautifully voiced singers in the pews here at St. John-Holy Angels! Thank you for singing loudly and proudly to our God...keep it up!

Evangelio: El amor a Dios y al prójimo en el mismo nivel v con la misma importancia. Las palabras de Jesús a la pregunta por el mandamiento madre de todos los mandamientos. van mucho más allá de lo concebido. Si tenemos en cuenta que todo piadoso repetía el "Shema" o "Escucha Israel" (Dt 6:2-6) en la mañana y en la tarde la gente tenía muy claro que el mandamiento principal era amar a Dios. Sin embargo, Jesús agrega en igualdad de importancia el amor al prójimo. Aquí está su originalidad principal. Es muy diferente aceptar el amor a Dios y al prójimo por separado que unirlo en uno solo. Un amor aplicando todas las capacidades. El Evangelio señala que se debe amar a Dios con todas las capacidades del ser humano (corazón, alma, mente, y fuerzas) y con la entereza de cada uno de ellos. Ahora bien, en caso del prójimo no se encontró mejor manera de decirlo más que a través de la indicación de uno mismo. Se hace eco de aquella antigua regla de oro común en la antigüedad: "haz a otros como quieres que te hagan". Es tan sagrado el amor a Dios como el amor al hermano. Uno y otro deben ser criterio fundamental de nuestra vida.
