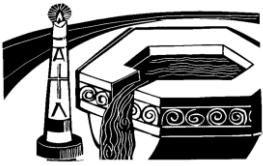

Baptismal Font Project Update

"In the history of the Church, the shape of the baptismal font has taken many forms which are reflective of local communities and of the universal Church's understanding of what is accomplished in the sacrament. Fonts can be square, round, cruciform, and octagonal among many other designs." Holy Angels will retain the octagonal shape of the font, in keeping with the shape of our sanctuary. The octagon, the eight-sided figure, represents the "eighth day", which is sometimes referred to as the first day of the week, or the day in which Jesus rose. How great will it be when we can finally see this font begin to take shape?!

Sadly, there will be no baptismal font at Holy Angels until funds are raised for a new, permanent structure. We are currently completing the design and structural phase of the project and hope to have a goal set soon. In the meantime, to help us along to our goal of installing by April 23, Easter Vigil, please consider donating to this project that will remain for generations to come. PARISH BUSINESS COMMUNITY **(Open for Business)**

Over the next year, Finance Council will seek out creative strategies to unleash the financial resources within our parish community. One of these strategies, approved several months ago, is the concept of the Parish Business Community (PBC).

Simply defined, it is a creative strategy to shift parishioner spending to parishioner businesses who will donate a percentage of their incremental business to our parish!

Here is an exciting example. If \$1,000,000 of spending across 2,500 families is shifted to the **PBC**, with an average donation of 10%, that would mean \$100,000 of incremental donations to the parish. If we had access to those funds now, it would make a big difference.

Since we have released our financial report, many people are asking, "How can we help?" Well – there is nothing like starting now and supporting our parish programs.
