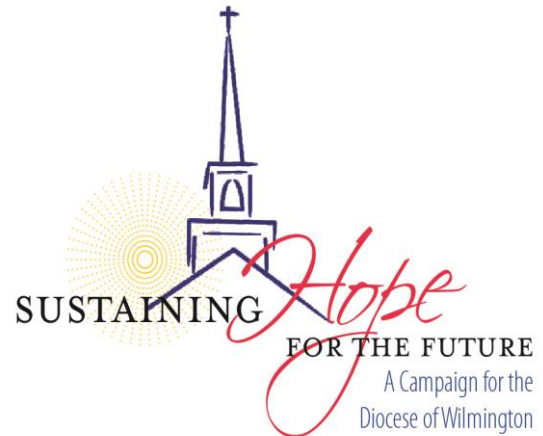

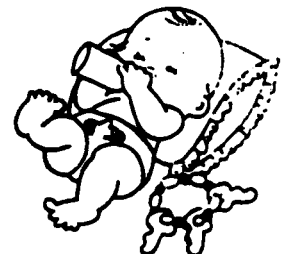
Parish Baby Shower

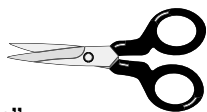

Jesús insistió siempre en la necesidad de producir frutos, no en cosecharlos sino en sembrar y hacer posible las cosas que Dios ha de producir. El Evangelio de hoy se refiere directamente al pueblo de Israel. La viña lo representa. Dios lo escogió para producir frutos de justicia, fraternidad, amor, Dios es el dueño de la viña. El liberó al pueblo de la esclavitud de Egipto para que pasara de esa situación de opresión a su servicio cumpliendo sus mandamientos que se sintetizan en el amor a dios y al prójimo.

El envió a sus siervos los profetas para recordar y exigir esos frutos, pero el pueblo no hizo caso, los rechazó e incluso mató a algunos. En el Evangelio de este domingo podemos leer e interpretar un mensaje en de manera personal. “Nosotros somos los sarmientos de la vid de Cristo”. Para que el sarmiento de la viña produzca frutos debe estar unida a la vid. Esos frutos son, el amor, la solidaridad, la fraternidad. Cristo nos pide superar el egoísmo y abrírnos a los demás.
